Addison looking to bounce back in 2025

The Addison Bulldogs are preparing to kick off a new season and will do so under the leadership of veteran Head Coach Mark Hastings. Hastings is a veteran of the Winston County Football as he was previously the Head Coach at Lynn High School, about 40 miles southwest of Addison in the far corner of Winston County. Hastings led Lynn to some of their most successful seasons in recent memory and brings a fresh approach to Bulldog football. "First of all, I have to acknowledge the tremendous job that Coach (David)

Smother's did here laying the foundation of this program," Hastings said.

"He did an excellent job here and this is actually the first job that I have taken in my career that I do not consider a rebuilding job. They had success last year and with the returning talent I believe that we can be successful pretty quickly here. I was drawn to this Addison job by their storied history, tradition of the program and the expectations that are here each and every year.

"I know a lot is expected but I can assure you that no one has higher expectations »

for our success than me and I will be my harshest critic. I love being around the young men and being a mentor to them.

"Building a lifelong relationship with your players, coaches and even coaches on the other teams is important to me. I believe that to be a good head coach, you have to be part psychologist, part father figure and just lead by example. You have to find out what makes your players tick and find that competitive nature in each young man."

"We are blessed to have some really good athletes here and I feel that they fit my offensive and defensive philosophy pretty well. We like to spread the other team out and get our playmakers the ball in space," Hastings said.

"We will take whatever the other team is giving us. If they are

selling out to stop the run, then we need to be able to throw the ball and vice versa. I think we are going to be able to do that. I have been very pleased with the effort and attitude that our young men have shown this summer both in the weight room and at our 7 on 7 camps."

Hastings broke down some of the returning impact players on the offensive side of the ball.

"Our quarterback situation is pretty stable. We have two young men that are leading for that role, Jr. Elijah Roberts and Soph. Scout Flynn. Both men have their strong suits, and the good thing is whomever wins the job the other can help us at other positions. Both are very talented," Hastings said.

"The running back room has three guys vying for the lead role. Seniors Seth Hammack and Stone

Talley and junior. Zayne Smith. Smith is coming back from a knee injury, and this is Talley's first year playing varsity football. Talley is a really good athlete and is not afraid of to put his shoulder into you. All three backs run hard but, in our system, you have to be a little more patient in choosing your holes to run through, so we are still learning that.

"We are lucky that senior Trennon Burns can play wide receiver as well as running back and will help us somewhere on the field this fall. As a matter of fact, all of our backs are pretty good at catching the football which is what we expect in this offense."


Hastings continued, "Junior Dathan Cleghorn has really stepped up this summer at our 7 on 7 camps at wide receiver. He has been a beast and runs exceptional routes.

Dathan has basically been our go to receiver and has consistently made play after play for us. Judah Wilkins is an excellent athlete and can play numerous positions. Michael Lee and Major Snoddy can play tight end and both are big bodies that have the ability to catch the ball, Hastings said.

"Our offensive line has the ability to be a strength for us. We return three senior starters, and each have been leaders in our summer workout program. They are Casen Hill, Brye Dollar and Brodie Willingham.

"This year I think we can go seven or eight deep at the offensive and defensive lines. I feel comfortable, as of now, that we will have some depth there this year which is a rarity in IA Football."



Addison will be running mainly a 4-4-3. A pretty standard defense in high school football using four down lineman, four linebackers and three defensive backs.

"The one thing that I can tell you is we will be physical, we will tackle, and we will play fundamentally sound. If a young man doesn't want to tackle, then we will find someone who will. We probably will have several kids playing both ways, offensively and defensively, but that is pretty standard in lower classification football."

The goal for every team this time of year is to win every game each week but more than that, Hastings wants to see his team approach the game the right way. Addison will travel to Lynn for a jamboree game

before the season officially kicks off and Hastings is looking forward to a fun atmosphere that night.

"Our number one goal is to play the game the way it is meant to be played at full speed and with discipline.

"If you can accomplish those two things success will follow. Naturally, you would like to go undefeated and win state, but we are going to focus on Lynn High School because that is who we play in the jamboree in a couple of weeks.

"It will be a game-by-game approach and like I said if we do the things we are supposed to be successful, and success will take care of itself," Hastings said.

"I can only assume that the atmosphere will be incredible.

Probably be like a playoff game. I coached a lot of those kids and have nothing but love and respect for the players, coaches and fans of Lynn High School.

"They treated me and my family great while I was at Lynn and I have the utmost respect for Coach (Steve) Cagle. Coach Cagle assisted me so much while I was there and he is a great man and coach."

The rest of the coaching staff is full of new faces as well. Coach Hastings will handle the offensive play calling duties while returning Coach Lee Williams will handle the defensive calls.

Dusty Hayes and Toby Denson will handle the offensive and defensive lines. Chris Lane will assist with defensive backs and running backs

while first year coach Lane Tubb will help with offensive and defensive positions.

Addison is in IA region 7 and should be in contention for the region championship on paper. Rival and region foe Meek may be the co-favorite with Addison while defending region champ Hackleburg may take a step back due to huge graduation losses, but the rest of the region slate looks manageable.

Non region games are very challenging with 2A Winston County, 4A Good Hope and 2A Decatur Heritage. The region championship will probably come down to the Oct. 10 matchup with Meek at Addison. A playoff berth and hosting a first-round game is not out of the question for the 2025 Addison Bulldogs.

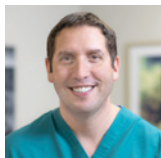

Cold Springs preparing to get back on the gridiron

The Cold Springs Eagles are coming off a playoff appearance in 2024 and with some impact players returning to the field this fall, the Eagles will be eyeing a postseason return in 2025. Cold Springs Head Coach Brendan Voce is preparing to kick off the fourth year of his tenure and he's optimistic after a great offseason from his team.

"I truly feel like since football season ended a year ago, we've had maybe our best offseason program," Voce said. "We had tremendous improvements in the weight room and that led into the spring game where I thought we played really well and then in the summer we've competed more than we ever have as far as 7-on-7s. So, we're super excited to get going."

Cold Springs will open the season on Aug. 21 with a county battle against the Hanceville Bulldogs and Voce and his team are looking forward to the matchup. County games are always special for the players involved and Voce hopes to have more of those matchups on Eagles' schedule in the future.

"We're super excited to play Hanceville. When I played back in the day it seemed like it meant a lot when you got to play county schools and that's something that's become really difficult as far as scheduling," Voce said. "Hanceville is the only county school we have on the schedule this time and we're hoping maybe next year we can add one or two county schools, but I think it means a lot to these kids to play against kids that they're familiar with."

One of the leaders of this year's team, Trey Bailey, has been impressed with the way the younger players on the team approached the offseason and is excited to see them contribute under the lights this fall.



"The younger guys on the football team have really showed up and showed out I think," Bailey said. "You've got younger kids like Eli Voce, Micah Hendricks and a couple of others that have really shown out in the weight room and they're putting in a lot of work to try and better themselves and better the team."

Voce and his staff have been working to adjust to the personnel they have this season and that started in the summer with an increase in 7-on-7 work. With talent and experience returning at the skill positions, the Eagles want to find and take advantage of as many impact players as they can.

"The 7-on-7s have been really good for us. In the past, we've tried to go to maybe one in the summer and this year we went to Addison twice to compete and one at Fairview and another at Good Hope," Voce said. "We have a lot different team this year. We don't necessarily have the big running back that likes to power it in there, we have a lot more skill guys so I think those 7-on-7s will really benefit us this season."

Bearcats working to be 'Ready and Resilient' this fall

Kickoff of the 2025 season is right around the corner and the Cullman Bearcats have been hard at work this offseason preparing to hit the field once again. The 'Cats will have some new faces on the field and on the sideline this fall as Head Coach Trent Walker prepares to kick off his first season at the helm. Walker graduated from Cullman High School in 2005 and spent several years working as an assistant under former head coaches Mark Britton, Matt Plunkett and Oscar Glasscock before taking the head coaching job at Lawrence County in 2021. Since returning to his alma mater, Walker has been blown away by the reception and commitment he's already received from his new team.

"It continues to be a surreal experience. It just feels right, and it doesn't even have anything to do with the fact that I'm home. The buy-in they have given me and the relationship that I've been able to develop with them has been great," Walker said.

"We have a great energy in the building; everyone is enjoying coming to football and this time of year there's just a certain number of things you have to do and hours you have to put in to make sure your team is ready for the challenges that lie ahead.

"But when we do roll call in the morning, nobody is running late, everybody is in the building and with teenagers that's not a common thing, so something is driving them here. Whether it's their relationships with their coaches or teammates or the energy in the building, it's just been awesome. It's been even better than I expected."

The Bearcats will have some experience returning on the defensive side of the ball and Walker has been pleased with the way those players have taken on a leadership role this offseason.

"I would consider our defensive line as the leaders of our program right now. We've got seniors all across there with a veteran junior group mixed in and in terms of what we want to be about on and off the field, that room is deep," Walker said.

"So, I think that's kind of the leadership group on our team. We have a couple very experienced guys in the back end and some older guys back there that don't have as much experience but as a group I feel good about them in the back end.

"At linebacker we've got a good mix of youth and some older guys that haven't played linebacker so we're kind of a mixed bag there, but I like how that position »

is shaping up and who the people are.”

On the offensive of the ball, the ‘Cats will have several new faces in new roles this season but Walker is encouraged by the work he’s seen them put in to prepare for week one.

“On the offensive side obviously we’re trying to find who our quarterback is going to be heading into this season. It’s a very fluid situation there and then we’re going to be very young on the offensive line.

“We have one returning starter on the offensive line and another guy who has played some in a back up role so we’re basically replacing an offensive line with a new starter at quarterback. That makes you a lose a little sleep at night,” Walker

joked.

“But I love the group. The offensive line has gelled tremendously under Coach (Jordan) Boatright, and he’s brought a real group mentality there so we’re very proud of where they are.

“Asher Drake is a guy who has made plays, and we’ve got some other guys that have been in the program for a while and Brooks Loftin coming back out so from a skill player standpoint, we like how those guys are coming together right now.

“When you’ve got a young quarterback, you’ve got to be able to run the ball and take some pressure off of him and I think we’ve got the pieces in the backfield and on the offensive line to be able to take shorten the

game and take some pressure off the quarterback.”

Walker and his staff have perennial postseason aspirations for the program but outside of the win column, they have goals for how they want the team to represent themselves and their school on the field.

“One thing we always talk about is being ready and resilient. We want guys to be prepared to face the storms of a game. I told the guys I’ve never been in a game as a coach or a player where there wasn’t a storm of some kind whether it’s a turnover or a momentum swing or whatever. So, we want to be resilient and play with relentless effort,” Walker said.

“Cullman is a place where our community knows where we fall on the spectrum of our particular classification, but they have a strong identification with what they expect the product to look like. It’s hard-nosed, physical defense, an offense that matches that physicality, plays disciplined football and represents our community well and our high school well. We plan to meet all those expectations.

“As far as performance during the season, our long-term vision is always going to be to host playoff games at Cullman. Those are the things we talk about. We’re very process oriented and I think the guys need goals like that to know we’re seeking something.”

One of those returning starters, quarterback Kolt Redding, has taken on more of a leadership role this offseason and has been encouraged by the work he and his teammates have put in to prepare for kickoff.

"We've got quite a few guys coming back and feel really good about all those guys. As long as our offensive line is still holding up strong, we'll be good," Kolt said.

"We're trying to help train the younger guys, so we have more depth behind all of us and we're trying to strive every day to get those guys ready for Friday nights."

The Fairview Aggies have racked up a lot of wins in recent years and with football season right around the corner, they're preparing to hit the field and add to that win total in 2025. Fairview claimed the Region 7 championship last fall and with a lot of game experience returning at key positions, Head Coach George Redding is excited to see what his team can do in his 19th season at the helm.

"Right now, our roster sits at right around 50 and we do have 14 seniors coming back with 11 juniors. We'll have about eight starters back on both sides of the ball so I'm excited about this group and what they've been able to do this spring and summer," Redding said. "I also like where we're at with our mentality. We can see where we need to be, and we've

on the line of scrimmage. Redding likes the group he has to work with up front and has been pleased with the way they have worked this offseason to prepare for their new roles.

"We like to play with six or seven linemen on offense. We lost some linemen to replace from last season, but we've got a good nucleus of guys coming back up front and we will have some new faces and we're excited about that.

"Just a couple years ago some of these guys were the new faces so we understand that it's part of the process and how they bring those young guys in and teach them to get them where they need to be is going to be very important for them. That'll be a great leadership opportunity for

our older guys up front," Redding said.

"We've got some new faces up front on the offensive and defensive lines and at a couple of the skill positions. We feel like a key for us each year is just trying to build that depth that we feel like is necessary in 5A. Our guys take pride in playing both sides of the ball but the more guys we can get ready to try and alleviate some of that, the better off we'll be.

"We're going to play against some teams that don't play as many guys both ways and if you're trying to make something happen in the playoffs, you're going to face that. So, these guys do a really job of working when they are out there on the field and coaching when they

come off it. We just feel like with the experience that some of these guys have, they've got something to give. So that's part of our plan.

"At all times, every play, we've got guys that are coaching and hollering and correcting things from the sideline and we want that, we encourage that. We feel like you don't know it unless you can teach it and these guys have really done a great job of taking that idea and moving forward."

Fairview has advanced to the playoffs in six consecutive seasons, so postseason appearances have become a standard for the Aggies, but Redding says the theme for this year's team is 'going deeper'. Not just on the field, but in all aspects of their lives.

"Going deeper is kind of our motto for this year. It's easy to think that just ties into football and trying to go deeper in the playoffs and all that but we really think that's just going to be a byproduct. Our goal for these guys is to go a little bit deeper in who they are supposed to be and their purpose," Redding said.

"Building relationships with these younger guys; we want to go a little deeper in that area. We want to go deeper in how we work and our work ethic football wise but the most important thing for us is just becoming a better person.

"Go a little bit deeper in our relationships and how we're serving others. If we can do those things we think everything else is going to take care of itself."

Raiders eyeing postseason return in 2025

The Good Hope Raiders are coming off a stellar 2024 season and they have high hopes once again in 2025. Good Hope recorded 10 wins, a region championship and hosted a playoff game a season ago and as he prepares to kick off his 11th season with the Raiders, Head Coach Alan Scott reflected on last year's team and what they accomplished.

"That was one of those seasons you didn't want to end. Going into it there really were a lot more questions than there were answers," Scott said.

"But the way the team came together beating West Point early on and then Fultondale really kind of gave them a lot of confidence and we were able to run off nine in a row, host a playoff game and beat a really good Hatton team to make it to the second round. It was just a fantastic year, and I can't say enough about that team."

Good Hope lost some impact players to graduation in May, but the Raiders will still have plenty of game experience returning on both sides of the ball.

Scott is happy to have experience and talent returning this field but he's been most impressed with the leadership and chemistry this team has already developed in the offseason.

"As far as returners go, I think we have about seven starters on either side of the football that are coming back. Obviously, you lose key guys each and every year but the ones we had back this summer have done a great job," Scott said.

"We've been lifting Monday, Tuesday and Thursday from 6 a.m. - 8 a.m. and the guys have been very consistent in showing up and being a part of that. The strength for these guys is just the leadership. We had a minicamp a couple weeks ago and we've watched these guys push one another on the field and even off the field so that's been good to see.

"With any good team the brotherhood that develops across the summer months is just critical to your success in the fall. So, as

long as they have that love for one another things should go pretty well."

An early injury derailed Good Hope's plans for the quarterback position last season but with the starter coming back healthy this fall, Scott is excited to see the offense develop around him.

"Tyler (Cone) and the season that he had was just phenomenal. He really stepped into a role that we didn't see him doing last fall and he did everything we asked him to. Parker (Johnson) going into the first game against West Point was the starter and unfortunately suffered an injury and wasn't able to come back until week seven or eight, so he's taken some snaps," Scott said.

"His dad was a quarterback at Good Hope for Coach (Alan) Dunkling and this season will hopefully be a good for chance him to prove himself in more than just two or three ball games."

The Raiders will kick things off with a jamboree game at Pisgah before hosting a county matchup against West Point in week one and Scott is eager to see how his team responds to the early adversity.

"They've been fantastic in their classification, so they've established themselves as a great program. That's going to be a great challenge for us to go up there. It'll be nearly two hours one way on a bus, and I know everybody's not real excited about that trip but it's good because to me it kind of simulates a playoff type of ride on a bus and you get to see how your kids respond to that adversity," Scott said.

"It's just a great litmus test. You get to see how your summer really went. Everyone always looks good in shorts, but West Point is always really big and really physical and have great tradition. That game has really gone back and forth the last few years and it seems like the road team has had the advantage, so we'd really like to break that tradition this year but at the same time we know if our guys go out there and play their tails off and do what we ask them to we'll have a shot there at the end."

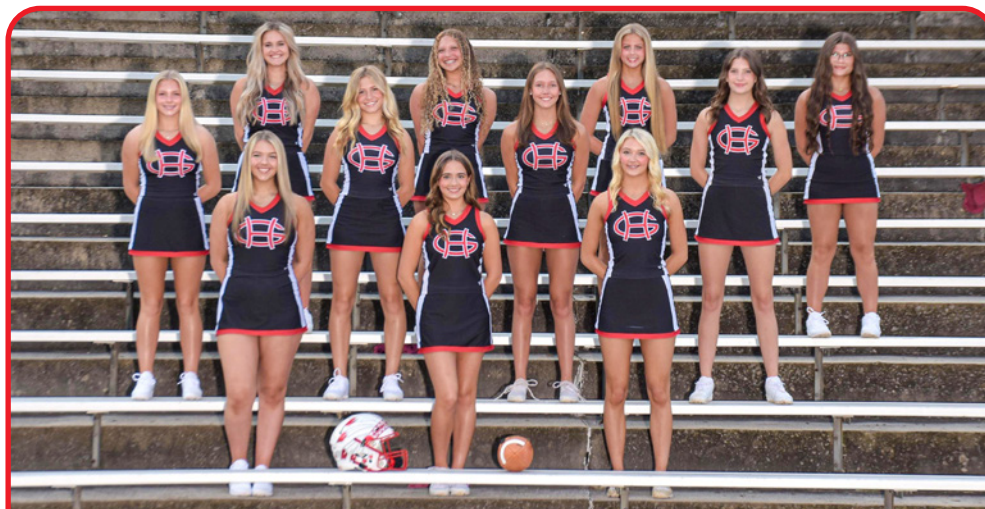

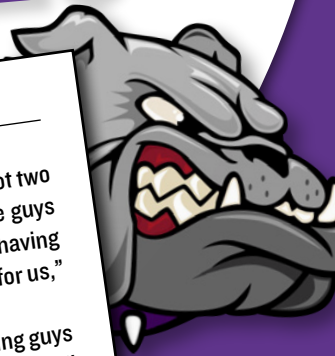

Hanceville hungry for playoff push in 2025

Another football season is right around the corner and that means it's almost time for the Hanceville Bulldogs to hit the field once again. The Bulldogs came up short of some of their goals a season ago but with experience returning on both sides of the ball and some new faces stepping up this offseason, Head Coach Levi Estes is excited to see what his team can do this fall.

"Looking at the roster from last year, we have about four of five starters returning on offense and then defensively we'll have about four or five back as well and a lot of those guys are playing both ways. We've picked up some new faces this year whether they were walking around the school or they've moved in so I'm excited about those guys that we've picked up and the guys we have returning," Estes said.

"A lot of our guys have a lot of experience from last year. We played a lot of young guys last year and game experience is one of the most important things you can have as a football player to see the actual speed of the game on Friday nights.

"Just looking back on the summer, we went three days a week in June and four days a week in July and these guys have been there every day busting their tails and doing the right things to get ready. We've brought in some new coaches that have changed some of the schemes up and done a really good job of coaching these guys up and making it easy for them to understand and learn and play as fast as they can."

The area that Estes and his staff are most focused on right now is the line of scrimmage. The Bulldogs will have a couple seniors to lean on up front but are looking for some younger players to step into some of those spots as well.

"Right now, our biggest leap to take is

on the offensive line up front. We've got two seniors up there and neither of those guys were part of our team last year. So, having those guys there is going to be good for us," Estes said.

"We've also got a bunch of young guys that are battling for spots up front as well so we're looking at playing some freshmen with a couple seniors and not having a lot of experience so that can be a little worrisome but at the same time those guys have worked hard, and they work together really well. They play together and they have each other's backs so that's something we're really focusing on so that's something we're really focusing on is getting them ready for Friday nights."

One place that Hanceville will have some familiar faces returning this season is at the skill positions. He's looking forward to seeing those guys continue to develop but he's been even more impressed with the way they've taken on leadership roles this offseason.

"Some things that I look at that are really bright spots is a lot of our skill positions on offense and defense are returning. Hunter Black is a two-year starter returning this year and you've got Drake Bentley and Javis (Leusby) and all these guys have started. Those are guys that we're going to lean on when we have the ball and also to stop the other team," Estes said.

"We're going to be young up front on both sides of the ball but at the same time with Jacob Jordan being a senior, he hasn't missed a day all summer and he's worked his tail off every day that he's been there.

"He's kind of the anchor of that group and he holds people accountable and does a good job of it. That's what you have to have in your older group, they have to hold people accountable, but they also have to be accountable in what they do and all these guys show those qualities."

Broncos ready to ride back onto the field this fall

Football season is approaching once again, and the Holly Pond Broncos have been preparing all summer to get back on the field and build on a solid 2024 season. The Broncos will have experience returning on both sides of the ball and Head Coach Will McDaniel is looking forward to watching this team develop after a very productive offseason.

"We probably have seven or eight different guys that start on either side of the ball returning. We lost a big senior group, but we played a lot of young guys at times last year. We'll have a ninth-grade quarterback, and he started a game at safety last year as an eighth grader, so he has a little bit of game experience," McDaniel said.

"We've got six seniors this year and five of them have a ton of game experience over their careers so we're not as senior led as we were last year but we've got a lot of good youth coming up and those guys have put in a lot of work this summer at playdates and 7-on-7 competitions and OTAs and all those things we've done over the last couple weeks."

McDaniel and his staff didn't have much time for installation before kicking things off last season, but they've had a full offseason to prepare this time around and they've been working on ways to put their players in good situations.

"We are a lot further along right now than we were 365 days ago. I got hired in the middle of June last year, so we didn't really get to install anything last year until July. Then we were able to go out and score 324 points last season which is the second most in school history and that was really with us basically starting in July. So, I think we're a lot further along," McDaniel said.

"That doesn't mean we'll replicate 324 points but we're able to do a lot more right now even with a ninth grader at quarterback and with skill guys that we've replaced just from being in the system for a year. It'd be

nice to run for about 300 yards per game this year instead of 275. That would help him out a lot but we're going to try to put him in positions to have the best chance of success and not put the game on his back."

Holly Pond put together an explosive season offensively in 2024 but with a new quarterback set to take the reins and some new faces at the skill positions, McDaniel is eager to see how some new players step into those roles.

"We replace Sawyer Olinger who was our do everything quarterback last year. He accounted for 180 of those 324 points last year so obviously you have to replace guys like him and we're not going to ask our ninth-grade quarterback to account for those types of numbers."

"We lost Brody Howard and Zayne Faulkner in the backfield as well so we're having to replace most all of our backfield outside of Boston Gibbs."

"He was a 1,000-yard rusher and accounted for 100 points and he's back but most all of our offensive skill positions we'll be replacing."

Holly Pond will have some familiar faces with game experience returning on the defensive side of the ball and after a summer full of competition, McDaniel is excited to see how they fair under the lights this season.

"Defensively we played a lot more bodies throughout the year. So, we played a ton of people defensively all the way through so we probably have more experience on that side of the ball even though some of them will probably play some different spots than they did last year," McDaniel said.

"So, thankfully with all the things we do in the summer with competitions, you get to throw people out there in 7-on-7 or 11-on-11 situations and see what happens. Even though it's not padded football, you get to see how they react to the heat and the competition."

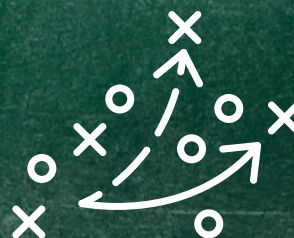

After punching their ticket the post-season last fall, the Meek Tigers are ready to put together another playoff push in 2025. The Tigers have experience returning all over the field and Head Coach Daniel Evans is happy to report a productive offseason for his squad.

"We've had probably one of the best offseasons that I can remember in a while. There haven't really been any lulls or any kids checking out or anything like that. We've been pretty locked in since January or February I'd say. So, we've had a pretty good offseason," Evans said. "We don't do spring because we'll play a jamboree, and I think that probably helped because they got a little time off before we started summer, but this group has been really good. They work, they're self-motivated and that's something that is becoming increasingly rare. We've got a good group of seniors and leaders that all like each other and our team chemistry is pretty good so that's definitely helped us be better in the offseason."

Meek will have some familiar faces at several positions back on the field this fall and that makes things much easier on Evans and his staff as they prepare to kick things off on Aug. 22.

"Fortunately for us we've got experienced guys at pretty much every level on offense and defense which is a luxury that doesn't happen very often. We've got some young guys that are going to have to step up in some spots but there's not really one up in some spots but there's not really one section where we're too young. It's a good mix of older and younger guys. Then we've got some older guys that have played a lot of reps, so I feel pretty good about us, especially up front on both sides of the ball. The defensive line was really good last year and it's going to be really good again this year. On the offensive line we've got three returning starters and a fourth guy that played a lot of reps so we're really just breaking in one



kid so that's good," Evans said. "It helps to have a quarterback and a running back that have a lot of reps and that's what we have. Evan (McCay) our quarterback will be in his third year as a starter. He started as a freshman and same thing with Hunter Wyatt our running back. He's someone that's been getting carries since he was a freshman so we're pretty experienced even though we've got some younger guys and that definitely helps us out. I'm feeling pretty good about where we're at and what we'll be able to do. Now nothing matters until you play games, but we feel good about the group we have."

The goal for every team when the season kicks off is to win every game each week and the Tigers certainly have big goals when it comes to wins but outside of the results, Evans wants to see his team play each snap hard, physically and at full speed.

"It's the same thing for us all the time, playing hard and playing physical. We always want to be physical, and we preach that at practice and with what we do in the weight room. We like to run the football and tackle well so physicality is what we're looking for but other than that I would just say our hustle and our drive. We play the game at full speed and want to make sure we're playing every down of every quarter of every game at full speed. We don't like to see kids taking plays off or anything like that so that's who we want to be. That's what our mindset is."

Vinemont ready to hit the field this fall

Fall is here, it's nearly time to kick off football season once again and that means the Vinemont Eagles are preparing to hit the field. The Eagles earned a spot in the 3A playoffs a season ago and with several impact players returning, they'll be eyeing a postseason return this year. Head Coach Stephen Robinson is entering his ninth season at the helm in Vinemont, and he was encouraged by the progress his team made in the offseason.

"We've had a great summer, it's been busy. We lost 13 seniors last year so that's a huge drop for a school our size, but we've got six seniors right now and they have all been on the field. A lot of them are two-way players, captains and leaders on the team," Robinson said.

"We've had a really good summer and went to a couple of 7-on-7s. We had an OTA with Geraldine, and I expect them to be really good, so it's been good so far and we're ready to get started."

The Eagles will have a veteran core to lean on this season, but Robinson is excited to see how some of the younger players will be able to contribute as well.

"We've got a lot of young kids. We have a pretty large junior class and a pretty large freshman class so that's going to help fill some holes. Our junior class has some leaders like Josh Rhodes who y'all have seen and Gabe Herrera whose been on the field for a few years. In our freshman class we ended up starting three or four depending on whether we were playing Fyffe or Good Hope in the spring," Robinson said.

"We started four on the defensive side of the ball and two on offense during

the spring game. We didn't have (Josh) Rhodes in the spring due to an injury, but he's had a really good summer and has kind of gained that step back that he lost from surgery and he looks good.

"A lot of those freshmen have really come on too and we may have a couple of them in the rotation or even in starting spots by the time Aug. 22 rolls around."

Vinemont finished third in the Region 5 standings a season ago and Robinson expects the region title race to be competitive again this fall.

"I think Winfield is the team to beat hands down. They didn't lose many seniors, and they've got some defensive linemen that are really good players. They have a lot of really good players but there are two individuals up front that really stand out," Robinson said.

"Gordo has a new coach so they're changing from a spread attack to what I believe is going to be more of a power I attack so we'll have to see if there's any kind of adjustment period for those kids because that's a different mentality going from slinging it around all over the field to playing like we do.

"Oakman has a new coach, but he's been on staff, so I expect them to be similar to the way they have been. Hanceville of course has their quarterback coming back and he's a really good player and I think Midfield has a new coach as well so there will be a lot of new faces to see and a lot of new things to prepare for."

The Eagles aren't planning on tweaking things too much this fall but Robinson is looking forward to seeing how they can take advantage of their team speed. He's been very pleased »

It's nearly time to kick off another football season in Cullman County and the West Point Warriors have been hard at work this offseason preparing to get back on the gridiron. Head Coach Kevin McCravy is entering his second season at the helm and after spending his first offseason split between West Point and Russellville, he's been happy to be with his team every step of the way this time around.

"We ended the year last season with 53 players and started spring with 90 so the program is growing. That number is sitting around 78 right now so the roster has grown a little bit. We've had a really productive offseason and have worked really hard," McCravy said.

"We got started right after Thanksgiving and we haven't stopped so it's really good to see the personal barriers that these kids have torn down throughout the offseason. It really helps that I was here for the offseason and not driving from Russellville every day. So, that's really helped me to be present every day for the offseason program. I've got my feet planted now and being here in the offseason has probably been the biggest difference so far."

One of this year's returning starters, running back Ollie Howell, has taken on a leadership role this offseason and is trying to bring even more of the young players along so they can contribute on Friday nights.

"I think the most important thing for us to teach the young guys coming is the heartbeat of our culture and our team. That's one thing that we've really been trying to push to our younger guys. Just letting them know that we're here for them if they need it and we're here for them on the field too," Howell said. "I just started my walk with Christ myself in January and I just recently started really praying and it's helped me calm myself before I go off to a camp or do anything. I've just been asking Him to give me the power to do

my best every day."

One of the things that McCravy and his staff have focused on in the lead up to this season is building depth. To help create that depth, competition has been expected and encouraged inside the building and McCravy believes that mentality will help the Warriors outlast their opponents this fall.

"Creating competition has kind of been our main theme throughout this offseason. Right now, I can't say for sure that this person is starting or that person is starting because every day we're competing. Nobody is really guaranteed anything right now and that's how we're approaching things," McCravy said.

"That's one of the things we've done this offseason is create depth at certain positions and the kids know it too. They know when they go out on the field that someone is going to be pushing them every day. They know that they may be the starting tight end today but there's someone right behind me that could take that spot tomorrow. That's something we've really hung our hat on this offseason, just keep pushing each other, create competition every day and we'll decide who's going to line up on Friday night. That's been a really good thing for us as a team is creating that competition."
